SUBJECT: KENAI NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE Summer Camps

The Kenai National Wildlife Refuge will be having several fun outdoor camps throughout the summer. All camps are 99% outdoors and 100% FUN!

Critter Camp is for children going into 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> grade this fall. Session 1 is June 21-25 and session 2 is June 28–July 2. This camp is nature craft based and includes activities about local Alaskan habitats and flora and fauna. Camp times are 10am-2pm each day and there is a \$50 supply fee per camper.

Get Out and Get Dirty Camp is for children going into 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> grade this fall. Session 1 is July 12-16 and session 2 is July 19-23. Campers participate in skill building activities including: tree coring, bird identification, digital photography, orienteering, and salmon dissection. Camp times are 9am-3pm each day and there is a \$75 supply fee per camper.

Pre-registration is required and both of these camps will be based at the Refuge Environmental Education Center on Ski Hill Road in Soldotna.
